



College of Arts and Sciences Collegiate Faculty Award

CAS Collegiate Faculty Award is the highest honor bestowed by the College of Arts and Sciences to active tenure-track faculty members who exemplify sustained excellence and merit the distinction of a named title. This award is conferred upon those who represent the highest aspirations of the professoriate. CAS Collegiate Faculty are recognized for their outstanding scholarship, exceptional teaching at both the undergraduate and graduate levels, and significant leadership contributions within their department, the college, or the university. CAS Collegiate Faculty will be chosen by the Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences in consultation with the Dean's Advisory Committee. Each awardee will carry the title CAS Collegiate Faculty, along with an annual \$8000 salary stipend (and OPE) and \$2500 research supplement for a period of three (3) years.

Each CAS department may nominate one tenured faculty member each year. Nominations to the Dean's Advisory Committee must include the following materials:

- A letter from the nominator (usually the head or director), not to exceed five pages, that addresses the nominee's accomplishments in scholarship, teaching, and service;
- A current and dated curriculum vitae from the nominee.

The nomination package should be uploaded to [this form](#). **The deadline for this year's nominations is December 6, 2024.** Late nominations will not be considered.

Compelling nominations will be comprehensive. They will include information about the nominee's scholarship, teaching, and service, and be detailed enough to convey to the Dean's Advisory Committee the benchmarks by which you and your colleagues have found the nominee worthy of this honor. They will provide a careful interpretation of the candidate's curriculum vitae, explaining why the record of publication, grant funding, outside recognition (including awards from within the university, but outside the college), and contributions to a positive and inclusive climate place the nominee among the most distinguished in the college. The nomination should also explain the impact of the nominee's scholarship both on their field and more broadly.
